



## Alvin "Al" A. Streder

Alvin "Al" Alfred Streder, age 85, of Frisco, Texas, passed away on Monday, May 18, 2020. He was born on March 8, 1935, in Chicago, Illinois, to Elsa (Kreter) and Alfred Otto Streder.
