June 20, 1975 - October 7, 2020

Bryan Melton fell asleep in death October 7th, 2020 at the age of 45. He was born June 20th, 1975 in Muskogee, Oklahoma to Doyle and Kathy Melton. When Bryan was one year old, his family moved to Springfield, Missouri where he enjoyed skateboarding and shooting fireworks off with his younger brother Brandon. Bryan enjoyed summer family trips to various theme parks but some of his best memories were going to Silver Dollar City in Branson, Missouri. At a young age Bryan had a fascination with how things worked. He was always asking “why?” and his curiosity always had him disassembling anything from remote control cars to radios. That eventually led to his interest in computers. In 2000, Bryan started his own IT company with his brother. Later in 2003 he partnered with his longtime friend Aaron Quarles and together they ran a successful IT management company. In his career Bryan met many people with whom he formed close friendships that continued for many years. In 2006 he welcomed his first child Maddox and then in 2008 came the birth of his daughter Sydney. It was obvious to many how much Bryan loved his children and how proud he was of their accomplishments. Bryan was a generous person and had good sense of humor. He loved music, snowboarding, playing and collecting guitars and, riding motorcycles.

Bryan is survived by his wife, Mary Melton of Lake Kiowa, Texas; children, Sydney Melton and Maddox Melton; stepchildren, Keaton White and Nyha White; parents, Kathy and Doyle Melton of Plano, Texas; brother, Brandon Melton and wife, Britney of Springdale, Arkansas; numerous other loving family and friends.

A funeral service will be held at 4:00 p.m., Saturday, October 17, 2020 at Turrentine-Jackson-Morrow Funeral Chapel, 2525 Central Expressway North, Allen, Texas 75013 and will also be live streamed on the Turrentine-Jackson-Morrow Facebook page. A recorded video will be available following the funeral service on Bryan’s obituary page.
