Howard Dean Bechthold of McKinney, Texas passed away on May 5, 2019 at the age of 89. He was born on January 6, 1930 to Fred and Elsie (Janzen) Bechthold in Hillsboro, Kansas. Howard was a 1947 graduate of Alice High school. He studied agriculture education at Texas A&I University in Kingsville, Texas, before serving his country proudly in the United States Air Force for four years. During this time, Howard served as a Drill Sergeant training new recruits at Lackland Air Force Base in San Antonio, Texas and Newcastle Air Force Base in Delaware. On October 6, 1951, he married his only sweetheart, Doris Light, in Alice, Texas. Howard and Doris were married 57 years before she passed away in 2008. He worked at Otis Engineering Corporation for 37 years.
