



Jack Donald Ross

A graveside service for Jack Donald Ross, age 91 of Leonard, will be held Saturday, April 10, 2021, at 1 p.m. at Leonard Cemetery.

Jack was born April 20, 1929, near Randolph, to Jack Ross and Willis "Bill" Ross. He was a lifelong resident of Leonard, graduating from the Leonard High School class of 1947. He married Annie "Jo" Tyler on July 29, 1949, in Bonham, and together they raised three boys. They were married for almost 68 years before her passing in May 2017.

Jack was a hard worker, earning a living as a carpenter and on the farm he owned. He was a member of the First Baptist Church of Leonard, the Leonard Volunteer Fire Department for 23 years, the Carpenter's Union since 1950, and was past President of the Leonard ISD School Board. He enjoyed farming, playing dominos - where he collected several trophies and awards over the years, and tending to his vegetable garden. Jack passed away on Saturday, March 27, 2021, at Greenville Health and Rehab in Greenville.
