With great sadness we announce the passing of Mr. James A. Almond. Mr. Almond suffered a stroke on January 17, 2016 and passed away on January 22, 2016. Jim was born June 20, 1936 in Albemarle, N.C. to Milas and Blanche Almond. He was a graduate of Stanly High School, N.C. State, and SMU in Electrical Engineering. Jim had a long successful career with Texas Instruments in Dallas and Johnson City, Tennessee. While in Dallas, he and Frances used their vacation time to take high school kids with Methodist Youth Fellowship, in the summer, to the Appalachian Mountains. They spread the gospel and repaired homes of the very poor that had nothing to give in return but gratitude. He also served for many years at the Allen Senior Center, Meals on Wheels, and Wednesday night Men's Bible Study at Stonebriar Community Church. Jim's life was characterized by his Christ like willingness to serve others by putting other people's needs ahead of his own.

Jim was preceded in death by his sister Linda McSwain.
